

ALLURI: THE SHAPE OF FEROCITY

He is not a man of words. Words do inspire. But finally, it is our actions that take us to the destination. This is rather the case of theory and practice. Theories are aplenty. There are very few practitioners. Existence is not possible without theories and their practice. Mahatma Gandhi had a non-violent the Indian independence theory movement. A few others believed in the eye for eye theory. Without theory, there is no practice. Our independence is a result of all



such theories and their practice. The Lal, Bal, and Pal trio and Aurobindo were extremist freedom fighters, while the followers of Gandhi were the soft liners of the struggle. Sakhdev, Uddav Singh, and Bhagat Singh were the updated versions of the extremist leaders. Alluri Seetarama Raju is one of them.



A programme commemorating the centennial birthday celebrations of Alluri was arranged in the college by the department of History on July 4 under the presidentship of Dr. P. Swapna Haindavi, principal of the college. In her inaugural address, the principal recounted the sacrifices of our freedom fighters in the freedom struggle. She said that Alluri dared the bullets of the British and invited death to bring freedom to India. Vice principal Prasada Rao remembered his bravery in the

attacks of Seetarama Raju on police stations in Rampachodavaram. He said that backstabbing is in the blood and veins of Indians and that selfishness is behind the fall of the giant Alluri.

Dr.P. Suryarao, Lecturer in Economics, pointed out that Alluri was a force that shook the British Empire at the age of 27, with limited resources and an ordinary and illiterate force of commoners. Alluri was killed by Malleswararao, lecturer. He narrated at length his biography and lamented that the British resorted to treachery to kill him. The programme ended with the saying of a vote of thanks by Dr. Tarakeswar Rao, Lecturer in Telugu

WORLD POPULATION DAY

Guidelines were discussed and modalities were worked out under the leadership of Dr. P. Swapna Haindavi, principal. A fresh schedule is given and on Saturdays and Sundays of every week the students visit the villages and do the survey, as ordered by the government.



Students were divided into groups and they were assigned mentors. Their work is constantly reviewed and they are directed to post photos of their visits to villages. Already the work has begun, and it will take some time before the programme is concluded.
