Science Exhibition

Not willing to be left behind in the race, the Botany department conducted a science Exhibition programme wherein about 17 experiment exhibits were arrayed. The programme was not of 'also ran' nature. A rather serious kind of an effort at excelling in doing the things, where more than 40 students, most of who were our girl force, joined hands to arrange all necessary things with a rare kind of enthusiasm and energy.

The preparations for the grand gala event had begun quite early, as early as 6 days before. Certain plant types they were going to exhibit



were chosen and a certain experiment allowed them to grow in certain conditions. A magnetic field was arranged around the seeds, to demonstrate that those in the magnetic field plants grow faster, as well give more crop yield. 'Vigna Mango' seeds were taken for the experiment.



Another exhibit was Ishihara colour blindness test. Colour blindness is what is transmitted hereditarily from parents to children. In a male, the gene which causes colour blindness is found on x chromosome, while in a female, on both the xx chromosomes, the gene is seen. Of all the students tested for colour blindness, 3 students were not able to identify green and red

colour from a certain distance and those students were advised to consult a doctor for counseling. The programme found an active participation from the students. All those staff and others who had visited the programme found the exhibits interesting and beneficial too. It was, in all, rather a hectic day that day.

Ambedkar Jayanti

Innumerable people contributed their mite to the country by their valuable services and measureless wisdom. Ambedkar is one among the rare gems India has seen. He was the architect of our constitution and his being at the helm of the draft committee as the president has resulted in certain decisions impacting the destiny of the country. April 14 was the day of Ambedkar's birthday.

Sri Srinivasa Rao, Lecturer in Politics, said that Ambedkar never advocated reservations in ployment and reservation of constituencies. He also went on to explain that he was opposed to imposition of Article 370 in Jammu&Kashmir, he wanted to make Sanskrit the official language of Indian Union. He also mentioned that his book, Waiting for a Visa was prescribed as text book at Columbia University.

The portrait of Ambedkar was garlanded by all and rich floral tributes were paid to him on the occasion.

SEEBECK Effect

Yet another effort by Dept of Physics and its students at learning by doing and experimenting. Today energy is generated using non renewable resources, which is cost effective, as also one capable of endangering the environment. Producing electricity by creating temperature difference is a simple



method, and one which requires further studies to enable production of electricity on a large scale.

Here in this experiment, two different wires are connected to form two junctions. Temperature difference here allows flow of temperature from cold to hot junction, when these wires are connected. Here what we see is called the SEEBAC effect.

In this experiment, copper and iron wires were used by the students and alternately plastic glasses, hot water, ice cubes and a multimeter was used to measure the flow of electricity where 3 milliamps of electricity was produced. Five students of M.P.C group, N.Devi, I.Priscilla Kumari, P.Pavani, V. Harika and K.Sravani under the guidance of Dr. J. Chandra Shekhar, lecturer in Physics performed this experiment.

International English Languages Day

In a function arranged in the college on the eve of International English Language Day on 23 April, Dr. P. Swapna Haindavi, Principal of the college opined that it is very essential to learn English language today. She said that it is the right time to learn the language.
