A special programme commemorating the day was organised in the college, by the Women Empowerment Cell. The Principal Dr. P. Swapna Haindavi, who attended the programme on the occasion as the Chief Guest recounted the childhood days of Savitribai Phule and the sufferings she went through for the education of women. The Vice Principal, Dr. P. Suryarao, hailed her services to the womankind. All other staff who attended the programme paid her rich tributes on the occasion and the programme ended issuing a note of caution of the danger bells ringing for women on every step.

AWARENESS ON THE DISHA ACT

History seems to repeat itself, if not in the events requiring our attention, atleast in the plight of women, as it is now. Suffering seems to be the only known language of women, for times immemorial. Women of olden days were not allowed to venture, for learning or other purpose. A motivational speech was delivered by Sri Ramakrishna, of Spandana foundation. In his speech, he stressed the need to make learning stress free and for providing opportunities for bringing out

Principal Dr. P.Swapna Haindavi, in her speech said that excessive pampering of children is leading to
